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THE TRUTH WILL SET YOU FREE

Pope Francis condemned “fake news” and called for a “journalism of peace” in his message for the World Day of Social Communications. The Pope said that false news-which he described as “disinformation online or in the traditional media”-serves partisan political purposes. Fake news, he said, builds upon “stereotypes and common social prejudices.” He argued that in the internet era, the development of “homogenous digital environments” contributes to a situation in which inaccurate reports are not corrected or challenged. The Pope's message is entitled: “The truth will set you free: fake news and journalism for peace.” The World Day of Social Communications will be observed on May 13, 2018. But the Pope's message for that occasion is traditionally made public on January 24, 2018 the feast of St. Francis de Sales, the patron of journalists. He decried the use of “falsehoods, rhetorical slogans, and sensational headlines” to suit partisan purposes, and said that conscientious journalists should pursue an “education for truth.” What matters, he said, is not the speed with which a 'scoop' is made but rather persons.

“The cure for Cancer has been found! Please forward this to as many people as possible in the interest of all those who are suffering from this disease.” How often have we each not received such messages on Whats App! For most of those who send or forward such news items it is a matter of service and are quick to take offence at the news shared being termed 'fake'. As for those who receive such messages, it's a question of probity and fairness. The sad part is that not one of those who indulge in such sending or forwarding are willing to ascertain the veracity of such news before circulating it ad nauseam. Worse, when confronted, they bluntly put the onus on the recipient to verify for himself/herself the correctness of the contents of the message received. We already have news going around that a 'good morning' message will set the sender back by a penalty grossing 18% GST while international media is awash with discussions of whether sharing false news and untrue information can be termed 'fake' and declared a punishable offence. Of course, there are many who consider such steps unwarranted, arguing that it will not be long before the government starts dictating what we should send out at all and what we shouldn't. Be that as it may, why can't we as believers infused with the power of the

Spirit at Confirmation, exercise restraint in terms of circulating unverified news? Frankly, unverified news bits on social media can at best be termed as SEG Sophisticated Electronic Gossip! What is worrisome is that this is a malaise that cuts across all strata of society, from priests and professionals to ordinary folk in the unorganized sector, with no perpetrator of SEG finding anything untoward about it. We do need to understand that emotions are often heightened when a case of Cancer is detected. Do we really need to add to their agony by circulating the 'cure' message far and wide without clarifying the bona fides of the source of the message or news? It would be good to ask ourselves the question as to why we, are ever so fond of sending or forwarding news that is untrue. The frivolous messages I've received include the death of a Superior General four years after her burial. I was present at the funeral! We have become agents of such fakeology nonsense.

Let us often recite the prayer Pope Francis has given us at the end of his message for this years World Communication Day:

Lord, make us instruments of your peace.

Help us to recognize the evil latent in a communication that does not build communion.

Help us to remove the venom from our judgments.


Help us to speak about others as our brothers and sisters.

You are faithful and trustworthy; may our words be seeds of goodness for the world:

where there is shouting, let us practice listening;
where there is confusion, let us inspire harmony;
where there is ambiguity, let us bring clarity;
where there is exclusion, let us offer solidarity;
where there is sensationalism, let us use sobriety;
where there is superficiality, let us raise real questions;
where there is prejudice, let us awaken trust;
where there is hostility, let us bring respect;
where there is falsehood, let us bring truth.

This was most interesting discussion during the personality development course for XI-XII. The boys and girls were frank and vivid in their description when they spoke about what happens in the mind when someone falls in love and when one falls out of love. Some of them spoke from their own experience while others spoke from what they had seen and heard. Their answers to the question, what is to be done in such situation, was equally interesting. They were helped to understand through open ended questions that you cannot force someone to love you just because you have



fallen in love with the person. Moreover, you will not think of doing any harm to the person whom you really love and hence, taking revenge by throwing acid etc., shows that you have no real love, but only an infatuation which is utterly selfish. Similarly all agreed that committing suicide is foolishness even if suicidal thoughts may occur at the peak of emotions. They were given the phone numbers to contact Paribar Jyoti even in the middle of the night if ever they are overwhelmed by any situation and at least to give us a chance to help them before doing anything drastic.

Many such topics relevant to their age were discussed in a participatory process, asking the right questions that helped them to reflect and evaluate their views and attitudes and come out with what we want to tell them, ultimately leading to attitudinal and behavioural change in them. This method was found to be effective since youngsters at their age prefer to find their own answers to life's questions.

Bishop Lobo asked the secretaries to discuss the draft in their respective commissions and get their suggestions.

The active participation during the meeting was an expression of solidarity and cooperation giving the indication that the planning process will give a new impetus to the diocese.
