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

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Editorial

The month of July begins with a reminder to pray for Priests. The prayer intention is that Priests may find intimacy with the Lord and friendship with their brother priests as they get fatigued by their pastoral responsibilities. Priests only can

understand priests, it is said, and therefore the greater need for cultivation of priestly communion, with the Bishop as to a Father and to other Priests as Brothers. While Bishop has responsibility for the entire Presbyterium there are others who can truly fill in the gap. The Deans should take active role to bring about this communion of Priests, both for pastoral collaboration and personal enrichment in spiritual life. The monthly recollection and

presbyteral meetings are occasions to nourish this twofold communion which, in turn, will make the pastoral service more fruitful and satisfying for priests as they serve the faithful entrusted to their care.

The Diocese is undergoing difficult times due to allegations and cases filed to protect the rights of the Bishop and counter cases filed against the Bishop. The message by his Excellency Bishop Franco Mulakkal and a circular by Msgr. Mathew Kokkandam, Vicar General, throw light on the facts and the need for prayer and unity in this time of confusion created by the working of evil. There is need for the Holy Spirit to descend afresh in the Church to guide everyone to be true followers of Jesus Christ. Let us support our Bishop with prayers invoking

Priests only can understand priests, it is said, and therefore the greater need for cultivation of priestly communion, with the Bishop as to a Father and to other Priests as Brothers. While Bishop has responsibility for the entire Presbyterium there are others who can truly fill in the gap. The Deans should take active role to bring about this communion of Priests, both for pastoral collaboration and personal enrichment in spiritual life.

Diocesan celebration to honour the Apostle of India and seek his intercession, especially for help in making a house, will be on **Sunday, July 1, 2018 at Rajasansi**. The representatives of all parishes are expected to reach for the celebration with the cross flag and receive special blessing for the Parish. The church is rejuvenated by remembering the sacrifices done by the great sons of the Church. We are challenged by the life of St. Thomas, the Apostle of India, who chose to go to the farthest place to bear testimony to the Lord, even sacrificing the life for the Lord. We are challenged to be witnesses in the place where the Lord has assigned us. To be the light and dispel darkness in the world is our Christian responsibility. In the face of increasing opposition to Christian life witness and public manifestation of faith we are all called to lay down our life like St. Thomas the Apostle of India.

The Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel falls on Sunday July 16 this year. Mount Carmel

reminds us of Elijah's opposition to the pagan cult of Baal by the false prophets under the patronage of Jezebel the wife of King Ahaz. She threatened Elijah after the false prophets were killed by him and took refuge on Mount Horeb (Cf. 1 King 19), the mountain of



God. Mount Carmel came to be associated with the Blessed Virgin Mary of Carmel when she offered the brown scapular to St. Simon Stock, a Carmelite Monk, as a sign of her maternal protection. St. John Paul II addressing the Carmelites said "Over time this rich Marian heritage of Carmel has become, through the spread of the Holy Scapular devotion, a treasure for the whole Church" (Message to the Carmelite Family March 25, 2001). The Diocesan Level Celebration of Mount Carmel will be on **Saturday, July 15** at Mount Carmel Church, Kakkon, Hoshiarpur. All the Parishes send representatives with the parish cross-flag and participate in the celebration.

Feast of St. James the Apostle is celebrated on July 25th. We have two Parish Churches dedicated to the patronage of St. James, at Shahkot and at Dharamkot Randhawa. St. James was the brother of St John and, like him, a fisherman. He was one of the witnesses of the Transfiguration and one of those who slept through most of the Agony in the Garden. He was the first of the apostles to be



martyred, being beheaded by King Herod Agrippa I to please the Jewish opponents of Christianity. He was buried in Jerusalem. A tradition beginning from the ninth century states that the relics of St James were brought to Spain some time after his martyrdom, (perhaps early, perhaps as late as 830). His shrine at Compostela in


Galicia, Spain, is the greatest pilgrimage centre in Western Europe. We seek his intercession as we are in the pilgrimage of our life.

Feast of St. Anna and St Joachim, Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and grandparents of Jesus Christ, fall on July 26. An ancient tradition, already known in the 2nd century, gives these names to the parents of the Virgin Mary. God chose His Mother to be born from this holy and venerable couple who prepared her to discern God's will and plan and cooperate with it fully, even to the point of offering her Son as an atoning sacrifice for the sins of humanity. Families should seek the intercession of Sts. Joachim and Anne in bringing up their children to discern God's plan and purpose for their lives. It is also celebrated as



grandparents' day. Children should be taught to respect and love the grandparents, learn from them and help them in their difficulties.

The feast of St. Alphonsa, the first Indian woman saint to be canonized, is on July 28. She is inspiration for the Religious to dedicate their lives for the sake of the lord through the sufferings. She belonged to the FCC congregation at Bharanganam. Her tomb is a pilgrimage centre for all especially for children who used to visit her and seek her help for studies. Now pilgrims flock to her tomb to pray for all kinds of needs and receive



physical and spiritual benefits through her intercession. We have two parishes coming up dedicated to her patronage, at Hussainpur, RCF, in Kapurthala District and at Puranashalla in Gurdaspur District. We seek her intercession and pray that these parishes may grow in strength and holiness and add to the diocesan community of faithful. May the religious learn from her spirit of total submission to God's will and become sources of life for the Church.

Great care should be taken in fulfilling the legal requirements while employing families in the institutions, especially if residence also is provided. Rev. Fr. Thomas Keepath, the Diocesan Procurator cautions all to be careful so that problems are not aggravated due to negligence on the part of those responsible for such appointments.



SHEPHERD'S VOICE



“The truth will set you free” (Jn. 8:32).

Dear Fathers, Brothers and Sisters,
Greetings in the name of the Risen Lord!

We are going through a period of crisis for the Diocese and for me personally. I am well aware of the news that is being spread alleging that I have failed in my responsibility and dignity of the office of Bishop. I would like to place before you that the investigations will make clear the false allegations made against me with the intention of tarnishing my name and destroying my ministry. I would request you to pray for me as I need to face the difficulties that have come at this stage and prove that the allegations are indeed false. The legal formalities are going on to regain my good name and establish the facts. I am not afraid of facing the realities of life and the dangers that are there when one holds an office and has to take tough decisions for the good of the community.


The Church should continue to serving the Lord despite the scandalous news that is being broadcast through the media. The words of St. Peter encourage me. “Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God” (1Pe 3:13-18).

In the modern lifestyle there are many dangers when one acts correctly. There is a possibility of offending some. It is not good to refrain from the good that one can do out of fear of offending others. One may have to suffer for it but it is God's way of making us participate in the Savior's work of redeeming the fallen humanity. Holy Father Francis said that we must communicate the good news and build up the community of faithful. “Communication is part of God's plan for us and an essential way to experience fellowship. Made in the image and likeness of our Creator, we are able to express and share all that is true, good, and beautiful. We are able to describe our own experiences and the world around us, and thus to create historical memory and the understanding of events. But when we yield to our own pride and selfishness, we can also distort the way we use our ability to communicate” (World Communication Day Message, 24 January 2018).

Dear Fathers and Sisters,


I am writing this to inform you that a complaint has been filed against the former superior General of the MJ Congregation and her family members and other supporters for plotting to murder His Excellency Bishop Franco Mulakkal unless her demands are met. The curia appointed Fr. Peter Kavumpuram, the PRO of the Diocese to do the needful. Police complaints were lodged in Kerala and Jalandhar. In retaliation the Sister has filed a complaint of sexual abuse against Bishop and the media has taken it up as the name of a Bishop is dragged into this type of controversy for the first time.

The previous Superior General of the MJ Congregation which has its headquarters in Jalandhar was transferred to Kuravilangad convent in 2013 when the new Superior General was elected. The Sister continued as Superior of the St. Francis Home, Kuravilangad without any problem. After her term of three years she was informed about her transfer in 2016. Then she requested that she should be allowed to continue for one year as she was undergoing treatment for back problem and wanted to continue there to complete the treatment. Considering her request she was allowed to continue for one more year as Superior.

In November 2016 a woman reached Jalandhar to complain against this sister accusing her of destroying her family due to the illicit relationship the sister had with her husband and threatened that if no action is taken she will go to the media. She was asked to submit her complaint in writing and the same was submitted in her own handwriting. The Superior General along with her council met the Bishop and apprised him of the complaint and Bishop asked them to make a preliminary enquiry and do the follow up. The accused sister began to threaten that she would not allow any enquiry as she was the former superior general and that the accusations are false. She said that she will leave the congregation if she is called to Jalandhar for enquiry. Since she was still considered respectable and as a person who guided the congregation for almost 9 years the General team felt that she should not be treated like any other sister. The General Council decided to meet her at Kuravilangad and in the meeting that took place between the General and the accused sister she refused to respond to the letter and to give anything in writing. After this in 2017 a new superior was appointed to the community. In response the accused sister submitted her resignation letter and asked for dispensation to leave the congregation on March 26, 2017. When this blackmailing technique did not work as there was no immediate reaction from the General as an afterthought she withdrew her application to leave the congregation after three days on March 30, 2017. She then started harassing the local Superior and there was constant complaint through phone by the Superior on the one hand and by accused sister and her supporters on the other hand. The General council then constituted a three member committee to enquire about the problems and to complete the procedure regarding the complaint received against her. When the committee informed about the meeting the accused sister called her family members and threatened the members of dire consequences against them and the Bishop if any action is taken against her. Since the atmosphere was disturbing the committee could not complete their procedure and reported about what happened at the meeting. Part of their conversations was recorded in the mobile phone. They accused the Bishop of unnecessary interference in the affairs of the congregation and made false allegations against the members.

The Superior of the House requested for a transfer even before completing one year due to the constant harassment and non cooperation by the accused sister. The General Council, after considering the situation and hearing from others who were experienced, decided to transfer the entire community

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except one sister who had serious medical problem and requested to continue there. The transfer order was given on March 23, 2018 and a new community was constituted. The accused sister was transferred to another community in Kerala. She reacted by stating that she will not move out from Kuravilangad and demanded that she should be made superior. However in her letter she requested that she should be allowed to continue there as she was undergoing treatment for back problem. She was directed to complete her treatment and move to the assigned community which had a medical college close by at Pariyaram at the earliest. In reaction she managed to get her own sister and another sister, members of the same congregation, who were assigned to Bihar and left their respective places and reached Kuravilangad stating that they have come to support the accused sister as injustice is done to her. They threatened that they would not move out until the said sister is given justice.


Meanwhile the Superior General went for a visit to the house as she was visiting the houses in Kerala. She reached the house on June 2, 2018 and wanted to meet the community and others who were staying there. The Chancellor of the Diocese was also present. On June 3rd the Sisters who were rebellious called their family members and suddenly appeared there and wanted to meet the Superior General. In the meeting they continued the language of threat and demanded that she should be reinstated as the Superior of the house. In their presence different demands were made by all the sisters numbering six of them. The sisters wanted salary for the years they were in the convent before leaving. The family members said that they will have to continue in the convent for the rest of their life. Then demand was made that Bihar region should be formed as they did not want to work in Jalandhar with Kuravilangad as their mission home. The family members demanded that an answer should be given before June 30. Since there was no willingness for dialogue and the family members kept on threatening the Superior General and Bishop of dire consequences they were asked to submit their demands in writing for the Council to consider their demands. After returning to Jalandhar a letter was sent to the sister on 13th June 2018 asking her to specify her demands in the order of priority for the council to consider. In her reply to this letter dated 23rd June 2018 she came up with a new allegation besides many other matters pertaining to the congregation. She accused for the first time that, "Bishop Franco Mulakkal abused me under threat". This was for the first time that the congregation received a complaint of this nature. Since the matter was beyond the purview of the Superior General it was forwarded to the superiors for appropriate action.

When the matter was discussed in the Diocesan Curia it was suggested that the civil authority should be informed so that if their threats are serious the police could look into the matter. The PRO of the Diocese was entrusted to do the needful. In retaliation the sister accused has also gone ahead with a complaint to the police, as threatened earlier, stating that she was sexually abused several times from the year 2014. This is a new revelation she had made as never before this accusation was brought to the Superiors. It cannot be considered as a genuine complaint as she has moved from one statement to another and one demand to another. The entire problem began only after the complaint was submitted against the sister who refused to cooperate and made other accusation of interference from the Bishop in the community and the congregation.

The entire matter is under investigation for appropriate action so that no superior is victimized for legitimate actions against erring members. Let us stand together in this moment of anguish with one voice. You are requested to pray that God's mercy may descend on this situation and bring back normalcy to the Church in Kerala, Punjab and India.


THE OFFICE OF THE DIOCESAN PROCURATOR

Domestic and Clerical Staff in our Institutions: Appointment Norms.

Dear Rev. Fathers and Sisters,


Regulating all the appointments through proper procedure and maintaining the service record of all employees have become an important need of the time. Therefore the following guidelines are drafted to be implemented in our institutions other than those of the educational institutions for which there are already appointment procedures. With regard to the general rules of appointment and related issues, “the service rules and Regulations – 2013” published from the office of the Diocesan board of Education would be applicable to all the employees under the Diocese of Jalandhar. The following additional guidelines are specifically applicable to those employed in all those institutions directly under the administrative purview of the Financial Administrator of the Diocese of Jalandhar.

1. ***Presently such Institutions are:*** The Bishop's House, all the offices functioning within the Bishop's house, all the presbyteries under the Diocese of Jalandhar, all institutions which draw money directly from the Diocese for the payment of its employees.
2. The appointment procedure and the forms to be filled up before issuing an appointment order will apply **also to the Catechists working under the Diocese of Jalandhar.**
3. The employer in all appointments would be the head of the institution or the head of the department under the Diocese of Jalandhar, who is authorized to appoint an employee by virtue of the office he/she holds as mentioned in the appointment letter issued by the Bishop of the Diocese of Jalandhar.
4. The appointing authority is to prepare a confidential file of the employee whom he/she appoints. The file should have the following documents:
 - (1) The handwritten application,
 - (2) Duly filled up application details: Forms: I to VI, supplied from the Bishop's House.
5. The salary of the employee should be fixed in consultation with ***the financial administrator*** of the Diocese, who in turn will be assisted by the account department of the Bishop's house to make sure that a uniform policy is followed throughout the Diocese.
6. While deciding the salary, care should be taken **that the minimum wage regulations of the Govt. of Punjab is adhered to.**
7. **While deciding the salary, the PF and ESI regulations are to be taken care of. The candidate should be apprised of the percentage of the employee's contribution to the PF and ESI funds,**



- and the percentage of the employer's contribution. The gross salary they would be getting is inclusive of the PF and ESI contribution from the employer's part.**
8. The employing authority (the head of an institution) should prepare two files with the necessary details and bring them to the Financial Administrator of the Diocese. The files should contain the filled up Forms supplied from the office of the Finance Administrator with all the details of the candidate whom one is proposing to employ in a particular institution. ***For Example: A cook is to be employed in the priest's house.***
 9. The employing Authority (Eg. The Parish Priest) must take the preliminary interview of the candidate and after getting the forms filled can appoint the person for a period of three months after informing the same to the applicant, that it is a temporary appointment.
 10. The first appointment should be on a contract basis for three months only. **In the contract it should be clearly mentioned and should be conveyed to him that within the period of three months the person can be relieved from the service without any prior notice or even without giving any explanation.**
 11. **During the three months tenure a consolidated salary should be paid to him in consultation with the Finance Administrator (Procurator) of the Diocese.**
 12. **Even after three months, the employee could be employed only on contract for an year and the same could be renewed every year. The salary could be always a consolidated pay from which the PF and ESI contribution should be deducted.**
 13. **As per the PF and ESI regulations, from the first day of joining the duty, the employee has the right to have the PF and ESI benefit, if the salary is below 15000/- and 20100/- for PF and ESI respectively.**
 14. **Since the employees under the Diocese of Jalandhar are entitled to have the PF and ESI provisions, the employing authority must inform the Procurator of the Diocese the fact of having appointed an employee in a particular parish or station. This is to avoid unwanted embarrassment to the Diocese if the flying squad from the PF or ESI department makes a surprise visit to the parish or station and enquire directly from the employee of the employment terms and conditions.**
 15. On the submission of the files, the Procurator of the Diocese will confirm the proposed salary to the employee by affixing his signature on the salary approval form supplied from the Diocese. *(It would be prudent that the employing authority should suggest to the candidate the proposed amount of salary only after consulting the Procurator of the Diocese to avoid unnecessary embarrassment).*
 16. **After the approval of the amount of the salary affixing his signature in both the files the procurator will return one of the files to the appointing authority to be maintained in the same parish or station in which the candidate is employed. One file will be maintained in the Procurator's office.**

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


17. The approved salary will be intimated to the employing authority from the bishop's house in writing, on the prescribed salary approval Form duly signed by the finance Administrator or his delegate.
18. The salary of the employee will be released only after completing the employee's personal file for the appointment, and only after issuing the appointment letter (the simple format of appointment) in which it would be clearly mentioned the duration of the appointment and the category of the employment. The duplicate of the appointment letter signed by the employee with the inscription below that "*I have received the original*" should be filed in the personal file of the employee.
19. It is the policy of the Diocese that no employee should be paid less than the minimum wage fixed by the Government of Punjab.
20. For those employees who are regularly engaged in overtime service even for a few hours daily throughout the whole month, **as an inevitable requirement of a particular post, like that of the cook, driver, etc. an overtime benefit is to be granted.** *The policy of the Diocese* is that such employee would be ***paid an extra amount of 10 days' wage***, calculated from the total salary of the month fixed for the year. This amount will be entered in a different column in the salary register after all the deductions in the yearly salary format prepared for the whole year, as overtime benefit. This amount will not be included in calculating the PF or ESI neither will be included in calculating the DA, wherever it is applicable.
21. Relieving an employee from the service by dismissal or any form of termination of the service of an employee is to be done as per the service rules of the Diocese of Jalandhar presently in use as printed manual.
22. Any disciplinary action on an employee should be done as per the service rules.
23. Before employing an applicant it is very essential to find out his credentials even through police verification, especially in the case of someone coming from another state. For those who claim to be Catholics it should be mandatory to get the recommendation letter of the Parish Priest. Those non-Christians from outside the state or from within the state there should be someone who will stand guarantee for him.
24. The head of the institution who employ someone for whatever period of time on contract should remember to keep the employee's file updated and the copy of the same should be supplied to the Bishop's house to be entered into the file maintained in the Procurator's office.
25. Disbursement of salary to the employees (even to a single employee attached to an institution) should be done through the bank transaction in all ordinary situations.




